More good news is that last week we got our Wellbeing Award for Schools. Wellbeing is high on our agenda for the whole school community and we are very pleased to gain this award.

However, the award is just a status and we embarked on the journey to audit what was great about wellbeing at Cherry and what would make it even better. This is for pupils, staff, parents/carers and all stakeholders.

We acknowledge we will always be on a journey with wellbeing and never reach a final destination, however we certainly have come some miles! Thank you to all but especially our wellbeing champions (pupils on the school council).

Every September we set ourselves new whole school objectives to improve and build on our existing provision for all. 




